ST. XAVIER'S SCHOOL HARMUTTY

St. Xavier's School, Harmutty (A Don Bosco – Senior Secondary) is a Catholic educational institution managed by the Salesians of Don Bosco of Dimapur Province, with the active participation of the Sisters of the Cross of Chavanod. Recognized as a Minority Institution (Certificate No. 41831, 2010), the school proudly enjoys Minority Rights and Privileges.

Affiliated with the CBSE (Affiliation No. 230010 and School No. 35094), our institution provides quality education up to Class XII, offering well-rounded academic streams in Arts, Science, and Commerce at the Higher Secondary level. Our educational approach is inspired by the methods of St. John Bosco, a visionary educator whose philosophy emphasizes a personal awareness of God, deep conviction, kindness, and the prevention of faults. Our mission is to nurture sound education by instilling in our students habits of piety, virtue, selfreliance, and discipline. Special emphasis is placed on developing character through comprehensive religious and moral instruction, ensuring that each student not only achieves academic excellence but also grows into a conscientious and responsible individual.

Admission Procedure

Admissions are conducted exclusively through the school office, where admission forms are available. Parents are required to ensure that the child's name and date of birth are accurately entered on the form. Please note: corrections to the name and date of birth will not be permitted at the time of CBSE examinations, regardless of errors made during initial admissions (e.g., Nursery).

To complete the admission process, parents must submit an official Age Certificate issued by the Municipality, Government, or the hospital where the child was born. The name and date of birth, once recorded in the school register, are final and cannot be altered under any circumstances. The child's name must match the details on the Aadhar Card.

Admission Policy

- 1. Fair & Transparent Process The school follows a transparent and fair admission process in accordance with CBSE norms and the institution's vision and mission.
- 2. Online filling up of the Application Form is encouraged All admission applications must be submitted through the Google Form to ensure accuracy and maintain a digital record.
- 3. Admission is open to all students **irrespective of caste, creed, gender, or religion**. Being a **minority institution**, preference is given to **Catholic students**.
- 4. **No Guarantee of Admission** The collection or submission of the admission form **does not** guarantee admission.
- 5. **Confirmation of Admission** Admission for shortlisted students is confirmed **only upon payment of the New Admission Fees** within the stipulated time set by the school authorities.
- 6. **Provisional Admission** Admission remains **provisional for Class XI** until all required documents are submitted within the deadline specified by the school and that the candidate passes class X exam.
- 7. Notification & Fee Payment Selected candidates will receive admission results on the school website on 21 April 2025 at 7.00 pm. Admission is confirmed only upon fee payment within three days of the declaration of the result of the entrance exam.
- 8. Fee Structure St. Xavier's School reserves the right to revise the Fee Structure as deemed necessary.
- 9. No Changes to Names or Date of Birth The school will not entertain requests for changes to a student's name or date of birth after admission confirmation, except for minor spelling errors. Any complete name change will only be processed upon submission of a court affidavit.
- 10. Admission Criteria Admission is granted strictly as per the criteria set by the School Management.
- 11. No Stream Change in Class XI Once registered, students in Class XI cannot change their academic stream. Requests for a change in stream will be treated as fresh admissions and will require payment of new admission fees.
- 12. PEN Number Requirement Students transferring from another school must provide their PEN (Permanent Educational Number) number from the previous institution.
- 13. APAAR ID All the students must also provide APAAR ID for the admission to the school.

Admission Procedure for Classes KG to VIII (Subject to Availability of Seats)

Admissions to Classes KG to VIII are limited and will be granted subject to the availability of seats. Parents/guardians seeking admission for their children are requested to register by completing the Google Form available on the school's official communication platform – the School Website (www.stxaviersschoolharmutty.org).

Candidates shortlisted for the entrance examination will be notified through the school Website. The entrance examination is scheduled to be held on **19 April 2025**.

Please carefully read the admission policy and follow the steps outlined below:

- 1. Online Registration: Fill in the Google Form provided for registration.
- 2. Entrance Examination Notification: A written entrance exam will be held on 19 April 2025 (Saturday) at 11.00 am to 12.30 pm.
- **3. Admission Form:** Candidates registered for the entrance exam should be prepared to purchase and fill out the hard copy of the Admission Form (available at the fee counter for ₹ 500/-) prior to the entrance exam.
- **4. Admit Card:** The admit card for the entrance exam is given along with the hard copy of the prospectus. The candidate is asked to fill up the relevant areas before the exam.
- **5.** Transfer Certificate (TC): A Transfer Certificate with the PEN (Permanent Education Number) is mandatory for the admission.
- **6. Birth Certificate:** Submit a self-attested photocopy of the student's birth certificate.
- 7. Academic Records: Submit a self-attested photocopy of the most recent examination mark sheet. The final mark sheet must be submitted once results are declared.
- **8. Conduct Certificate:** The original Conduct Certificate must be submitted, duly issued by the Head of the previous institution.
- Aadhar Card: A copy of the Aadhar Card of the student and the parent need to be submitted for APAAR ID.
- 10.Fee Payment: Once admission is granted, the school fees must be paid within three days of the result.
- 11. Original documents must be presented for verification during the admission.

Admission Procedure for Class XI (Humanities, Science, and Commerce)

To ensure a smooth and efficient admission process, kindly follow the steps outlined below:

- 1. Online Application:
 - The application form (Google Form) will be available on the school website (www.stxaviersschoolharmutty.org) from 10 April 2025.
 - Applicants can register for the Entrance Exam by completing the Standard Online Application Form (Google Form). The application fee of ₹ 500 must be paid upon

collecting the hard copy of the **Prospectus** from the school Fee Counter from **13 April 2025** onwards.

2. Closure of Admissions:

The Online admission process will be closed on 18 April 2025 by 4.00 pm.

3. Name Verification:

The names of the student and parents must be exactly as mentioned on the Aadhar Card to avoid discrepancies.

4. Entrance Examination & Interaction:

- The First Entrance Exam will be held on 19 April 2025 for Class XI and others classes depending on vacancies available.
- The Second Entrance Exam is scheduled for May (Class XI only), with the date to be announced via School WhatsApp Channel (Don Bosco: St Xavier's School, Harmutty) and on the school website (www.stxaviersschoolharmutty.org).

5. Publication of Results:

• The results of the entrance exams will be published on the school website on 21 April at 6 pm with the form number.

6. Admission & Fee Payment:

- Selected candidates must complete the admission process by paying the new admission fees on 22 / 23 / 24 April 2025.
- For those appearing for the second entrance exam which will be held in May, the admission date will be announced on the school website at a later stage.
- Payment methods include cash payment at the Fee Counter, through School App,
 G-Pay and QR Code.
- Failure to complete the admission within the stipulated timeframe will result in the forfeiture of the seat, which will be offered to candidates on the waiting list.

7. School Counter Timings:

o The school counter will be open from 22 April 2025 (9:00 am - 1:00 pm).

8. Provisional Admission:

- Admission to Class XI is provisional. Candidates who fail to pass the qualifying examinations will not be permitted to continue in the school.
- 9. Fee Policy: All fees paid are non-refundable.
- 10. **Management's Discretion:** The **management reserves the right** to modify, alter, or introduce additional terms and conditions as required in the best interest of the institution.

Required Documents for Admission to CI XI

After applying for entrance exam, parents/guardians must submit the following documents for verification during the **admission**:

- 1. Birth Certificate A self-attested photocopy of the student's birth certificate.
- 2. Academic Records A self-attested photocopy of the most recent examination mark sheet (Final mark sheet must be submitted after results are declared).
- Transfer Certificate (TC) Original Transfer Certificate from the last institution attended with PEN (Permanent Education Number) and APAAR ID are mandatory.
- 4. Conduct Certificate Original Conduct Certificate issued by the Head of the previous institution.
- 5. Admission Form The duly filled Admission Form.

6. Aadhar Card: A copy of the Aadhar Card of the student and the parent need to be submitted.

Note: Original documents must be presented for verification during the admission.

To assess students' rational knowledge and communication skills, an interaction session is conducted alongside the entrance exam for a comprehensive evaluation.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL THE STUDENTS

To maintain a disciplined, respectful, and focused learning environment, all students of St. Xavier's School, Harmutty, are expected to adhere to the following rules:

- Language Policy: English is the medium of instruction and communication in the school. Students are expected to converse in English while on the school premises.
- 2. Vehicle Restriction: Students are strictly prohibited from bringing any motor vehicles (including bikes, scooters, or cars) onto the school campus.

- 3. Respect and Courtesy: All students must show due respect, courtesy, and politeness in their interactions with teachers, staff members, and fellow students.
- 4. Care for Property: Any damage caused to school property must be compensated by the student(s) responsible.
- 5. Personal Belongings: The school is **not responsible** for the loss of personal belongings such as books, pens, money, or valuables. Students are advised **not to bring large sums of money** or valuable items to school.
- Custody of Belongings: Students are solely responsible for the safe custody of their personal items.
- 7. Use of Electronic Devices: Mobile phones, music players, and similar electronic gadgets are strictly prohibited within the school premises. Confiscated items will not be returned without disciplinary action. In case one needs to bring to the school, it must be submitted to the office on arrival.
- 8. Office Hours: No school-related matters will be entertained after office hours or on holidays.
- 9. Interaction during Class Hours: Parents/Guardians are kindly requested not to enter classrooms or speak to teachers or students during class hours. For any school-related queries, please approach the school receptionist.
- 10. Attendance: A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory to be eligible for examinations.

Class Days for all the students

Each student is issued a **School Handbook** (**School Diary**), which serves as a comprehensive guide for the academic year. It includes the **Yearly Planner**, **attendance records**, **and permission for early leave**, **homework assignments**, and **communication notes** from teachers and the Principal to the parents. A student is expected to bring the school handbook (school diary) daily to the school.

In addition, the handbook contains the **rules and regulations of the school**, **daily prayers**, and **details related to examinations**. It is an essential tool for maintaining regular communication between the school and home, and for helping students stay organized and responsible throughout the academic year.

SCIENCE LABORATORIES & DIGITAL CLASSROOMS

St. Xavier's School is equipped with spacious, modern, and well-furnished laboratories designed to meet the needs of today's dynamic educational environment. Dedicated labs for Biology, Chemistry, and Physics provide students with hands-on experience and foster a spirit of scientific inquiry. We currently have a well-equipped Computer Lab. The Mathematics Lab, Skill Lab, and other facilities are in the process of being set up.

Students are encouraged to make the **best use of laboratory facilities** to deepen their understanding of scientific concepts. Maintaining **discipline and silence** during lab sessions is essential to ensure a focused and safe learning environment. Wearing the **prescribed white lab coat** is mandatory during all practical sessions.

To enhance classroom engagement and digital learning:

- SMART PANEL BOARDS are installed in Classes XI and XII.
- Smart TVs and interactive smart panels are available for lower classes to support visual and participative learning.

Additionally, monthly mock competitive examinations are conducted for Science stream students of Classes XI and XII to help them prepare for future academic challenges.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

The **School Library** at St. Xavier's serves as a gateway to knowledge, inspiring students to develop a love for reading and independent learning. It is well-stocked with a wide range of **reference books**, **fiction**, **non-fiction**, **periodicals**, **and educational resources** catering to various age groups and interests.

- Students are encouraged to make **maximum use of the library facilities** to enrich their academic and intellectual pursuits.
- Reference books are strictly for use within the library premises and must not be taken outside.
- The **library remains open during school hours**, providing access throughout the academic day.
- Any damage, such as scribbling or tearing of pages, will result in the **student being charged the full replacement cost** of the book.
- Students must maintain silence in the library at all times

Co-Scholastic Activities

At St. Xavier's School, Harmutty, we are deeply committed to the **holistic development** of every student. We believe that education goes beyond textbooks and classrooms. To this end, we offer a vibrant and diverse platform for students to explore their interests, develop life skills, and grow into well-rounded individuals.

- A variety of clubs and activities are available to nurture talents in music, dance, art, sports, public speaking, leadership, and other areas of personal growth.
- These co-scholastic engagements are thoughtfully designed to encourage **creativity**, **teamwork**, **self-confidence**, and **discipline**.
- Active participation in these activities is an integral part of the student's overall assessment and is reflected in the Progress Report Card.
- Students are encouraged to enrol at the beginning of the academic year in clubs such as the Football Club, Cricket Club, Scouts and Guides, Eco Club, Media Club, Karate Club, and others to enhance their co-scholastic scores.
- Achievements at the district, state, or national level in co-scholastic fields will also contribute
 positively to the student's report card. To ensure their achievements are officially recognized,
 students must fill out the prescribed form, have it signed by their Class Teacher, and obtain a
 counter-signature from the Principal.
- The final merit of each student is determined by considering both scholastic and co-scholastic performance.

SCHOOL OPENING

The school will reopen on 28 April 2025 for all the students from NY to XII. CI XI will have their classes at a later stage.
